Elton working out in the hot sun, drinking hot tea, and so tired. I was not interesting to write till tomorrow. But I have just got a letter from Dr. Wain (his doctor) it has about read like up and of course I am more or less nervous. he said Sam had two convulsions Tuesday. and this morning at three and five o'clock. had none. but has come out of them. but left him in a weak, dazed condition. he wants she should come up there

as he wishes to have a talk with-
her, she will go tomorrow morning, Gus
or Cleo will go with her. She
feels bad. every letter she has had
from, Sam, only a few lines at
a time that he wants she should
come and get him. Just what
can't be. we could never take
care of him. and he could not
have the treatments he needs. we
feel like a funeral all the time.
can't, or can't make any plans.
just let each day take care of
itself. The Purans wood mason
association of which Lela & Sam
are members, have offered her
the business of collecting the
dues, has to go from house to
house. here in the manner, will
let her take her own time. do as
much or little, as she can when
she can. she will get me rushed

away he called me to come to the back door
and told me to see how even the rows

needed to get seeing than any one else.
said in about five days we could have
all the beans we could eat and ever any
beans could be, not a thing at all
but needs and a few radishes - but he
saw them all night. Friday. 3.25; as you
see this did not get finished but right.
Mr & Mrs Bechtel came. but the emptying
of the needs. The girls went on ^{to} the
car this morning. don't know where
they will be home. Train comes Milwaukee
every hour. takes two hours to make the
trip. they want to be home before eleven or
twelve. will let you know Monday how
they found and left. Saw. did you get
the last money order. 15.00 I think you
ought to have had it last Saturday.
Hannah I wish I could. hear your rheumatism
was better. I think about you and about
my sister. if I don't write of any thing but as
I will find. she is going to home. Uncle Henry. ^{Wangman}
and my self ever for lunch. Let me know - ^{Pal} - yes.
I think she will ask Clara. I have planned to go home
the 30th. but she wants I should wait a little
longer. Let me know a little better how you
are. Hope this finds you all feeling better ^{that}
