Dear brother and sister.

My first-letter of the new year.
If I had one dollar for every letter I have
sent home the first of the new year we
could buy two horses. I am exclaiming
five dollars and the girls are reading
" " of Nancy Ruth money. (Your first
installment hope it will get so they can
do the same every week. I told Lela may
be this was where your four million is
coming from.) You can call part of
it "tatter money" or "candy" money just
as you wish. I think of you all the
time. This cold weather. I don't know
how you stand it. Better than I think
of the wind. no horse. while I know
it makes the chimes easier. it is
hard not having a horse. Lela is
getting ready to go down town will
mail this. we have not sent the
candy yet. may tomorrow. not much
doing with candy these days. will
make again tomorrow. the girls needed

the rest. Lela spent New Years with
Luu, or rather Monday. Alice went
with her. she only stayed about two hours.
Luu felt awful bad not to come home.
Lela says he seems all right. I would
not be surprised if he did come home.
don't know when. How are your teeth
Nannak. I think of them aching all the
time. try to think they are not. Alice
gave Lela + Luu each 10.00 and the children
2.50 each. Jennie just phoned. had a
letter from her mother Miss C. etc.
she is sitting around. feels fine.
she had letter stay where she is.
for it would be — for her bene-
ficial and finally still there.
I anticipated New Years night. Was
Loff invited the remnants of our
old club to see the Old Year club
& the New Year in, when it started
the first year we were here there
was five tables. now only three.
I went with Wills folks. did not
get back to Wills till "three o'clock
in the morning". Wills brought me
home Tuesday, none of us went away

to dinner. Jean^B has not been to
school this week. I am afraid she has
pin worms. the way she looks and acts.
Jennie says to give her sage tea.
a few lines from Edna. has ordered
two more pounds of candy. that makes
fifteen pounds they have ordered.
in about two + one half weeks. this goes
to California. Lola is ready to go to
next-stap. wish I could come and stay
a few days. I want to write to Mildred
but can't find her address. seems to be
at 1024 N. Edward St. I'm not sure.
